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Recognition for Gannochy Trust 'Lifetime Neighbourhood'

The Gannochy Trust and its partner Anderson Bell Christie, Glasgow architects, are honoured that the 'Lifetime Neighbourhood' has been recognised by some of the leading housing, design and architecture awards nationwide.

Launched back in October 2020, the development has won the Large Residential category and a sustainability accolade at the Glasgow Institute of Architects Awards, as well as the Residential Multi-Unit and Affordable Housing categories and a Landscaping / Public Realm commendation at the Scottish Design Awards.

The new housing has also been shortlisted for the Affordable Housing Development category at the Herald Property Awards and three awards at the Inside Housing Development Awards which take place in London in November. These include Best Affordable Housing Development, Best Healthy Homes Development and Best Older People's Housing Development.

We are delighted that the excellent work of our partners is being recognised, and that the core aim of the Trust to improve people's lives, is being fulfilled. We think A. K Bell would have been proud.



Tenancy Spotlight on allocating our houses

We currently advertise on our website and use social media to notify people when our housing lists are open. It is only then that applicants can download a form and submit it.

Current tenants who require to transfer for any specific reason can request a transfer form at any time, but must have some sort of housing need and meet our criteria.

We assess all applications following our criteria and point system to determine who is allocated a property.

This year a Housing Review Group was set up to review the criteria and look at how properties are allocated.

Housing Criteria

All applicants must meet the following two criteria to be considered for a tenancy:

- that they are currently resident in Perth and Kinross; and
- this will be their only residence.

Applications will then be assessed against a further three criteria:

- one or more housing needs, which cannot be met in their current accommodation;
- they have the ability to financially sustain the rental payments and general costs of the house and garden; and
- they can maintain the house and garden to a satisfactory standard.

Gardener's Corner

It's hedge cutting season on the Gannochy estate and the Grounds team have already made a start.

The perimeter beech hedging around most of the gardens forms part of the iconic look of the Gannochy estate and it is the responsibility of the Trust to maintain them. You will receive a note through the door 2 to 3 weeks in advance of your hedge being cut so that you can clear the way in your garden for the team to be able to access the inside of your hedge safely. Please ensure that dog fouling is cleared away. The team will cut and clear trimmings from the outside and will cut the inside of your hedge leaving you to clear those trimmings.

2021 has provided us with a great growing season for flowers and veg but conditions in April and May weren't so good for

early flowering varieties of apple blossom, and the Autumn crop is a bit thinner on the ground this year. Make the most of what you have and we hope they bounce back for 2022.

As well as hedge cutting season, it's also the start of hedgehog hibernation season. Remember to watch out for hedgehogs in your leaf piles, or better still, build them their very own hedgehog house.
