

Quarrymill Woodland Park is owned and managed by The Gannochy Trust, a charity founded in 1937 by Arthur Kinmond Bell. Known by many people as A K, he was a highly successful businessman and outstanding philanthropist who gifted Quarrymill Woodland Park to the Trust.

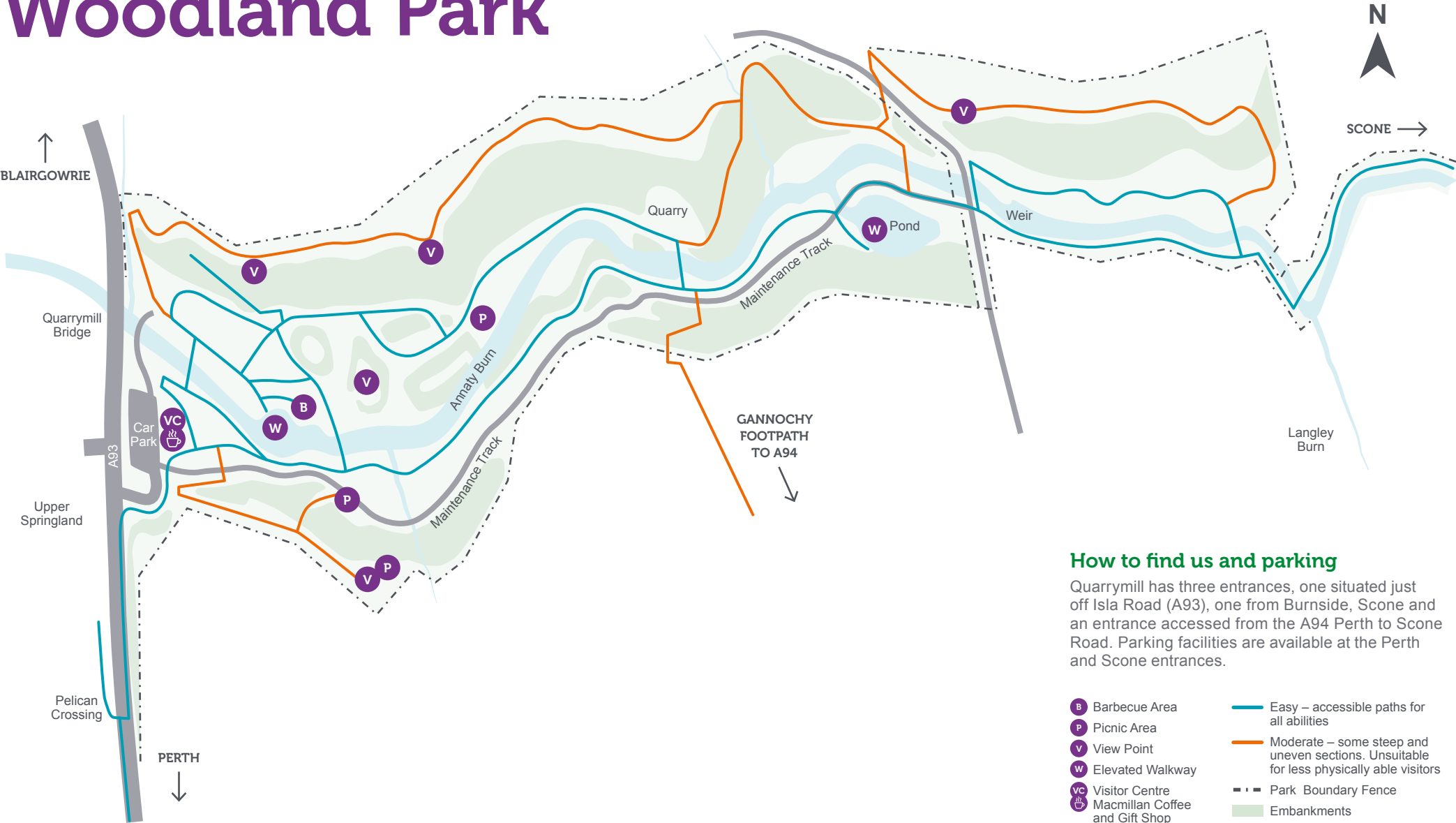

How to find us and parking

Quarrymill has three entrances, one situated just off Isla Road (A93), one from Burnside, Scone and an entrance accessed from the A94 Perth to Scone Road. Parking facilities are available at the Perth and Scone entrances.

- P Picnic Area
- V View Point
- W Elevated Walkway
- VC Visitor Centre Macmillan Coffee and Gift Shop
- Easy – accessible paths for all abilities
- Moderate – some steep and uneven sections. Unsuitable for less physically able visitors

- Embankments
