Gas and Electrical regular inspections

The Trust undertakes an annual inspection and service of each house that has gas boiler powered heating to ensure the ongoing safety and operation of the gas supply and heating system. There is also an inspection undertaken on a five yearly cycle to check the condition and integrity of the fixed electrical installation of each house. Residents must provide access for these inspections which are a legal requirement.

The Trust also undertakes independent checks on a random sample of these inspection works to ensure that these critical works are maintained to the highest standard. The NICEIC approval body oversees the electrical work and Energy Technical Services oversee the gas inspection work.

Those residents who have given access for these follow up checks have helped us to monitor and ensure compliance with the required standard and we appreciate your cooperation.





Perth Wildlife Watch

Perth Wildlife Watch group started last year and offers a FREE nature club for children aged 8-12, run by Perth and Kinross Countryside Trust in partnership with the Scottish Wildlife Trust.

The group is part of a UK wide network of Wildlife Watch groups supported by the Wildlife Trusts, and aims to help children connect with their local nature and wildlife. Centenary celebration of the building of the Gannochy Housing Estate

Next year will be the centenary of the completion of the first homes on the Gannochy Housing Estate and we have a few centenary events planned for 2024.

- The Centenary Community Orchard will be created in the green space on Camilla Bell Crescent in Spring.
- Centenary Youth Nights at the Curly A series of free Friday night drop in youth nights in May with BBQ.
- Completion of the Curly Play Park The development of the Curly will be commissioned in 2024 and opened in the Summer.
- The Centenary Time Capsules Residents are invited to contribute to two time capsules to be opened in 2124. One capsule will be for under 16s, and the other for adults. We would like your ideas for what residents in 2124 will find when they open them, and we are hoping that all of the Gannochy streets will be represented in the time capsules. It could be photographs, small gifts, stories, a diary, a letter to a specific address, a video guided tour of Gannochy it's up to you. Keep the items small, ensure you include your name and address (and age if you're under 16) so residents in 2124 know where they came from. We will display the contents of the Time Capsules at the Curly in July before packing them up and burying them, so we need your items by June. Further information on how to get involved will be circulated in the new year.
- **Gannochy Events Group Centenary event** The events group have been invited to organise a centenary event, funded by The Trust for residents.
- **Doors Open Day** is a Perth and Kinross Heritage Trust annual event, and we hope to share some of our archives at an event in September 2024 with a focus on the building of the Gannochy housing estate.

Christmas Lights

The Estate looks magical at this time of year with all the Christmas trees and lights around the houses and gardens. Please remember to take them down from the rhone's and hedges by mid January so the grounds team can proceed with their cyclical cleaning and cutting of hedges - Thank you.

Winter procedures

Frozen pipes To avoid discomfort to you and your family, and to avoid damage to your house:

If you have an external boiler house, please ensure that the door is always kept closed in the winter months to protect your cold water supply, heating and hot water.

Find the location of the main supply stopcock so that you know where to switch the water off if there is a problem. They tend to be located under the kitchen sink or under the bathroom window.

Outside Tap To avoid burst pipes to your outside tap, switch off the gate valve that feeds the pipe and open the outside tap to drain the water from the pipe.



Gas leaks and carbon monoxide alarms

In the event of a gas leak or suspected gas leak, or if your carbon monoxide detector activates with a continuous alarm, please contact National Grid Gas Emergencies on 0800 111 999 immediately and please take the following steps;

- Turn off gas at meter (Quarter turn the handle on pipe at the side of the meter).
- Turn off all gas appliances.
- Don't use electrical appliances or light switches.
- Open all doors and windows.
- Don't smoke or use naked flames.

Don't turn supply back on until remedial action is taken and authorised by a competent person.
