Looking back at 2025.... and forward to the New Year


2025 has been another busy year for the Gannochy Trust, both on our estate and through our grant making. On the estate we have been pushing ahead with our refurbishment programme on the original houses using a range of new techniques which has allowed us to begin the transition away from gas boilers to more environmentally friendly air source heat pumps for heating and hot water. On the housing management front, we adopted a new rent management policy in September which sets out the support the Trust will provide and process we will follow for tenants who fall behind with rent payments.

On the wider estate we were delighted to open a completely new footpath on Muirhall Road which provides a virtually traffic free route for our residents from Gannochy all the way to the Jubilee car park on Kinnoull Hill. The Trust also celebrated the centenary of the completion of Doo'cot Cricket Park and Pavillion in July by hosting a match between Perth Doo'cot Cricket Club and the Marylebone Cricket Club.

During the year the Trust awarded more than £3m in grants to charities in Perth and Kinross and across Scotland. This included £165,000 to Letham4All to support their activities throughout the Letham area, £100,000 to Jeanfield Swifts towards a new 3G pitch, and £195,000 for Perth Autism Support.

Looking to 2025 we will be continuing our programme of maintenance and refurbishment across the housing estate. We also plan to carry out a tenant survey in early 2026 so that tenants can provide feedback on living on the Gannochy estate. This will be undertaken by an external research company and we will provide more detailed information to tenants in the new year. In the meantime I would like to wish you a safe and peaceful festive period on behalf of the Trustees and staff team.

Tenancy Spotlight

Festive External Decorations

The Estate looks magical at this time of year with all the Christmas trees and lights around the houses and gardens. Please remember to take them down from the rhones and hedges by mid January so the Grounds Team can proceed with their cyclical cleaning and maintenance of hedges.

Condensation

As the colder months are upon us, it is good to try and manage condensation in the home, especially in the bathroom. Ventilation and heating are key. A clean and working fan is essential, so please report fans that require maintenance to the Gannochy Trust office. Consistent, background heat (around 18°C) rather than short bursts, combined with good ventilation will help. Managing sources of moisture will also help e.g. by putting lids on boiling pans, ventilating rooms where clothes are drying, and drying off windows, sills, wet walls, and tiles. Heating rooms anywhere in the house will reduce condensation on the windows.



Gardener's Corner

Memorial plaques The Trust provides public benches on the housing estate, Quarrymill Woodland Walk, the Curly, and in Doo'cot Park. Many people ask for benches to be dedicated to loved ones, and to ensure this is affordable and available, we can supply a plaque for you to engrave, and that we will fix to benches at a cost of £50. Up to eight plaques may be fixed to a bench. For those that have already purchased a plaque, please be aware that they should not be polished as this will damage them. Please just wipe the surface with a damp cloth.

Dog Fouling With earlier sunsets, there's an increase in dog fouling on the estate creating both a health hazard and is unsightly. Dog faeces can include parasites that are harmful to young children as their immune systems are not fully developed. This is why dogs are not permitted in the Curly.

Winter Conditions Please take care in the winter conditions. The salting and gritting of unadopted roads and paths is undertaken by the Trust on week days (excluding Christmas and New Year holidays) when we have available capacity. All other areas are the responsibility of the Council.

Winter procedures

Frozen pipes To avoid discomfort to you and your family, and to avoid damage to your house:

If you have an external boiler house, please ensure that the door is always kept closed in the winter months to protect your cold water supply, heating and hot water.

Find the location of the main supply stopcock so that you know where to switch the water off if there is a problem. They tend to be located under the kitchen sink or under the bathroom window.

Outside Tap To avoid burst pipes to your outside tap, switch off the gate valve that feeds the pipe and open the outside tap to drain the water from the pipe.

Gas leaks and carbon monoxide alarms

In the event of a gas leak or suspected gas leak, or if your carbon monoxide detector activates with a continuous alarm, please contact National Grid Gas Emergencies on **0800 111 999** immediately and please take the following steps;

- Turn off gas at meter (Quarter turn the handle on pipe at the side of the meter).
- Turn off all gas appliances.
- Don't use electrical appliances or light switches.
- Open all doors and windows.
- Don't smoke or use naked flames.

Don't turn supply back on until remedial action is taken and authorised by a competent person.
